REPEATER REPORT

We are still using the spare 2 meter antenna at 100'. The tower crew came up on 2/8 with their sweep gear and have determined that we have a bad antenna.

I have not heard from them since. They left me believing that the antenna would be covered under warrantee and I am just waiting to see how they made l out.

If I can get some 1/2" heliax jumpers made up for the bottom of the antennas the crews said they will install them the next time they go up there.

The repeaters seem to be working fine but of course there is a diminished signal to the south and east with the 100' antenna mounted on the northwest side of the tower.

I have been starting and running the generator on occasion and it is working fine.

There have been two failures of the old DC breakers so far so I finally bypassed them all. So at this point I need to do a complete overhaul of the power panel. New DC breakers are expensive. So I am thinking that I will replace them with fuses and toggle switches.

Rippers 2012 Auction



On Wednesday Evening March 21st 2012 at 7:00 PM, Everyone is invited to attend a very interesting presentation about "N V I S" (Near Vertical Incident Skywave (NVIS) antenna)

This presentation discusses emergency radio and antenna building techniques. Our guest speaker will be: Charles Alfano, WA2GUG. Charles is a full time New Your City resident. He will be making a special trip up to Catskill for the evening. So we are hoping for a big turnout.

NVIS, is a radio-wave propagation method that provides usable signals in the range between groundwave and skywave distances (usually 30 to 400 miles, or 50 to 650 km). It is used mainly for military and paramilitary communications and by radio amateurs. The radio waves travel upwards into the ionosphere, where they are refracted back down and can be received within a circular region up to 650 km from the transmitter. If the frequency is too high, refraction fails to occur and if it is too low absorption reduces the signal strength.

Opportunity. When it knocks, make sure you open the door and let it in. We have an excellent opportunity knocking at our doors to welcome new hams to our ranks. The RVWARS is sponsoring a two day Technician Class License preparation course on two consecutive Saturdays; April 21st and 28th. Details can be found on the RVWARS web site at www.rvwars.com. I'll be filling the role of lead instructor for this program but your help is needed. Read through the course outline and let me know which unit or units you'd be willing to help with during this important venture. The best way to contact me is via email: wayneg1231@fairpoint.net. Another opportunity presents itself in the form of the VE session at the end of the course. We will be offering exams for all levels of ham licenses. So, if you have been waiting to upgrade to General or Extra, April 28th will be the time to do so. Dust off those study guides or go online and get yourself prepared for the exam. If you are already a General or Extra another opportunity awaits. Why not become a Volunteer Examiner and assist in giving the licensing exams to new and upgrading hams? The process requires you to submit some qualifying paperwork but it is a straightforward process. Check out the VE information at www.arrl.org.

Often we hear fellow hams lamenting the fact that several new hams received their licenses, came to a few meetings, were heard on the air a few times and then they seem to have disappeared. What happened to them? Have these new hams been mentored by one of our members after they got their license? Have they been welcomed with open arms into the ham community? Have their mistakes and lack of skill been corrected politely and with encouragement? Do they feel that their time at meetings has been worthwhile? Have they been invited to participate in public service events? Is their 'ham radio career' being monitored and supported by a mentor? Another opportunity: even if you feel that you are not able to be a presenter at the Technician Course at least come to the club house, get to know the candidates and support them during the course and offer to be there for them after the course and throughout their 'ham radio career', offer to be their mentor and their coach.

After spending 32 years in public education and 10 years as an instructor in the fire service, I can vouch for the fact that the best way to really learn something yourself is to prepare to teach it and then teach it to someone else. There is much more to ham radio than VHF and UHF repeater activity. It's a good place for new hams to get started and get their feet wet, but as mentors let's teach the new hams about HF voice modes, digital modes, and yes, CW. Let's not just explain how to operate using those modes but let's also explain the technology behind those modes. How does

SSB work? Why does CW and most digital modes get through when voice doesn't? In the process, we will all become more knowledgeable about these aspects of ham radio.

Let's discuss some of these topics during our meetings and during the Round Table. How about a 15 or 20 minute technical presentation at each meeting? Have some used equipment you'd like to get rid of? Donate it to the club to be passed on to new hams who aren't really sure what they want or need. The stipulation would be that they are to pass it along to other new hams when they are finished. Why wait for the annual

auction? Got something to sell? Bring it to the monthly meeting, have interested members make offers, if an offer works for you make the sale and give a percentage to the club for repeater expenses. How about those of us that sell items via ads in the newsletter give a percentage to the club for repeater expenses?

Let's talk up ham radio! Let's spread the word about the upcoming course. Let's always be positive about the hobby and public service during our QSO's. Let's help Stan with the newsletter. Everything you do with the hobby is good material for the newsletter. Write about a new rig, a new antenna, an interesting QSO or your experiences at a hamfest. Literary skills are not mandatory. Send in your contributions and the editor will do the rest. Include pictures! Help make the newsletter an interesting read for veteran and new hams alike. Not everyone shares the ideas I

The Extra Class Question of the Day

As many of you already know, I have written study guides for the Tech and General Class license exams (www.kb6nu.com/tech-manual). Until now, however, I've shied away from writing an Extra Class study guide. The two main reasons for this is that the material is much more complicated and there's a lot more of it.

This year, however, the NCVEC is updating the Extra Class question pool, and I've decided to bite the bullet and do it. So, I'm now in the process of writing a No-Nonsense Extra Class Study Guide.

After I got started on this, I had a D'oh! moment. It occurred to me that instead of just publishing this material in the study guide, I could also post some of it to my blog (www.kb6nu.com). So, now I have the "Extra Class question of the Day" feature on KB6NU.Com.

In reality, it's usually more than just a single question because many of the questions are on the same topic. That's OK, though, because in reality, I don't post these every day. So, it all works out. Having said all that, here's an example. The correct answer to the question is in bold.

Extra Class question of the day: meteor scatter

Amateur radio operators use many different ways to get signals from one spot to another. Perhaps one of the most interesting is meteor scatter propagation.

Meteor scatter propagation is possible because when a meteor strikes the Earth's atmosphere, a cylindrical region of free electrons is formed at **the E layer** of the ionosphere. (E3A08) **28 - 148 MHz** is the frequency range that is well suited for meteor-scatter communications. (E3A09)

Unfortunately, these ionization trails are relatively short-lived, so to communicate via meteor scatter, you need to either be able to detect when these paths are available or be transmitting when the paths are available. *All of these choices are correct* when talking about good techniques for making meteor-scatter contacts (E3A10):

- 15 second timed transmission sequences with stations alternating based on location

- Use of high speed CW or digital modes

- Short transmission with rapidly repeated call signs and signal reports
