



EchoLink up and Running on RVWARS 2-meter Repeater

The installation of EchoLink on the RVWARS 147.21 repeater has been completed in record time and is ready for use.

Club member and long-time user of Echo-Link, Len, N2LEN, installed the equipment and software with the assistance of Stan, WA2UET who reported: "Len has been a HUGE help in setting up the audio on the EchoLink. He is able to take the EchoLink computer here and put it on his screen at his home and make adjustments while listening to the results. I replaced the transceiver here and the interface so Len had to do it all over again. It sounds great to me and others that have reported say it sounds good."

I plan to use the EchoTime in conjunction with EchoLink to make announcements etc. I will keep any announcements as short as possible. The only problem that could arise is if the announcement starts during the pause after the courtesy beep and the next PTT, it could speak at the same time someone else is speaking. That should not happen often. The announcements will normally only play on the top of the hour. It is a great way to get information out

Using EchoLink: DTMF commands for EchoLink

Here are the available DTMF tones for the EchoLink system to date. If we continue to make them available we might add some in the future. In order for these DTMF tones to function with EchoLink I had to disable the "Mute" function on the Controller. The "Mute" covers any tones sent by users to keep the tones private. e.g. - if you were using the Phone Patch and calling your wife the DTMF tones would be muted so someone would not be able to record your phone number.

Personally I think that being able to connect to a node and especially disconnect from EchoLink is far more important than the "Mute" function. Be aware that this will be a topic of discussion at a club meeting soon. Bob, WB2DUW and I are open for your thoughts.

The Local Wx is from my weather station here in the Hamlet of Ghent. The other Wx info is from Weather Exchange probably from Albany...

The disconnect will disconnect a station from EchoLink, if there is more than one station on then it will disconnect the most recent station.

Submission: An RVWARS member (being above reproach) needs only to request the certificate when the required contacts are in the log. Contacts on the WARC bands do not count for this award. A separate certificate is available for VFH/UHF contacts.

Hold on ma, let me go light the radio!

The Kerosene Radio was made in Moscow for use in rural areas. This all-wave radio was reported powered by the kerosene lamp hanging above it. A group of thermocouples was heated internally to 570 degrees by the flame. Fins cooled the outside to about 90 degrees. The temperature differential generated enough current to operate the low-drain receiver. Regular listeners may have wanted furlined union suits, though: it worked best in a room with open windows!

While this article was treated as a curiosity in the June, 1956, issue of *Popular Science*, with solid state components in the radio, you could get some nice performance out of this system. You could even run a QRP ham radio transceiver this way. Does anyone have a schematic for this set up? You could use the thermocouple system at night and a solar cell array during the day to run your QRP station. The thermocouples could be heated by a metal stack for a Franklin stove or hot air from a



fireplace or the hot air from a Coleman lamp.

Combine this power system with the \$50 SSB transceivers developed for the ARRL home brew challenge and you have a nice set up for a mountain cabin or camping trip. Sounds like great fun.

It might be an interesting way to power a Field Day station, too!

CONGO, 9Q. Station 9Q1EK has been active on 160 meters around 0450z and 15 meters around 1000 to 1300z. QSL via SM5DJZ.

NAURU, C2. Dick, C21DL has been active using RTTY on 20 meters around 2230 to 0130z. QSL via DJ2EH.

GERMANY, DA. Operators Axel, DH8AK, Sebastian, DO6ELW, Dirk, DK4DJ and Henning, DK9LB will be QRV as homecalls/p from Fehmarn Island, IOTA EU-128, from March 14 to 21. They will also activate Lighthouse Marienleuchte - Old Tower, ARLHS FED-151, and Lighthouse Marienleuchte - New Tower, ARLHS FED-016. Activity will be on 80 to 10 meters using SSB, PSK31 and SSB on 2 meters. QSL to home calls.

IRAN, EP. Sadegh, EP3HF has been QRV on 15 meters around 0930z and then 17 meters around 1000z. QSL direct.

CLIPPERTON ISLAND, FO. A large group of operators are QRV as TX5C until March 17. Activity is on 160 to 6 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY. QSL via N7CQQ.

ST. VINCENT, J8. Babs, DL7AFS and Lot, DJ7ZG are QRV as J8/homecalls until March 20. Activity is on 80 to 6 meters using mostly SSB, RTTY and PSK. QSL both calls via DL7AFS.

BELGIUM, ON. Members of the radio club OSA are active during 2008 as ON70REDSTAR in commemoration of the Red Star Line shipping company. QSL via ON4OSA.

DENMARK, OZ. Look for DK9LO to be QRV as OZ/ DK9LO from Romo Island, IOTA EU-125, from March 8 to 21. QSL to home call.

They will also use the special call TF4Y in the upcoming Russian DX Contest. Activity will be on all bands with an emphasis on the newer and low bands. QSL all calls via RV3ACA.

GABON, TR. Alain, TR8CA has been active on 160 and 80 meters using CW from around 0500 to 0600z. QSL via F6CBC. ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA. Chris, MOAJT is QRV as V2. V26CC until March 14. Activity is on the HF bands using mostly CW with some SSB. He plans to be an entry in the RSGB Commonwealth contest. OSL to home call. In addition, Bob, W4OWY and Mark, W9OP are QRV as V25WY and V25OP, respectively, until March 18. Activity is on 160 to 10 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY, with an emphasis on 160 and 80 meters if conditions permit. QSL to home calls.

ST. KITTS AND NEVIS, V4. Nick, G4FAL is QRV as V4/ G4FAL from St. Kitts, IOTA NA-104, until March 10. Activity is on 80 to 10 meters using mainly CW. This includes an entry in the RSGB Commonwealth contest. QSL to home call.

TURKS AND CAICOS IS-LANDS, VP5. Nigel, G3TXF plans to be QRV from Providenciales using special callsign VQ5XF in the RSGB Commonwealth contest. Outside the contest he may be active as VP5/ G3TXF. QSL both calls to home call.
